Additionally, the line-by-line review, conducted by Ernst and Young, can help inform how public spending can be made more effective and efficient for the people of Ontario. I expect the principles outlined in those documents to guide your approach to exercising good governance and effective oversight at your agency.

As well, our government recently announced the completion of a review of provincial agencies, conducted by the Agency Review Task Force. This effort is part of our goal to ensure that agencies continue to deliver modern and effective services for the people of Ontario. My ministry has received recommendations from the task force and will be communicating our government's directions to you. I will look to your agency to support their implementation.

The 2019 Ontario Budget directed my ministry to work with Ontario Creates on two initiatives in particular: modernizing the Ontario Music Fund to focus on activities that bring the biggest return to the province and investments that create opportunities for emerging talent to achieve success; and enhancing the tax credit certification process to streamline administration and reduce application processing times.

As a key ministry partner, I will rely on your help to advance ministry priorities such as promoting the arts and fuelling the creative economy. I also ask that your staff work with my ministry to ensure your agency's mandate, objectives and business model are aligned with government priorities, and continue to promote economic development, investment and jobs in Ontario's vibrant cultural media industry.

I value your role in promoting, enhancing and leveraging investment, jobs and original content creation in the province's book publishing, film and television, interactive digital media, magazine publishing and music industries. I ask that you ensure your agency continues to deliver this important work in a manner consistent with government priorities.
